
We used star stickers and a white pencil on black card to create our own cool constellations.










Primary Champion Schools Track & Field Event

- Shot Put (2kg Years 4-6)



Day for Daniel - Thursday 26th October



Day for Daniel will be hosted at Currambine Primary on Thursday 26th October. The day aims to raise awareness in school communities about the importance of protective behaviours, and ageappropriate protective behaviours lessons will be taught in our school on Thursday 26th October.

Protective behaviours are a set of skills that form part of the WA Health curriculum and aim to support children to recognise when they feel unsafe and to take appropriate action to feel safe.

Key messages for students:

- If I feel unsafe, I must act so I am safe.
- There is nothing that I cannot talk to a safe adult about.
- I need to know who the safe adults are in my life.
