Reminder of Traffic & Parking Guidelines



As we know, parking can be a challenge for our school, as it is at all schools, and we need to work together to improve the current arrangements. Patience by all involved is the key to moving our students away in a timely and safe manner. Please find below guidelines on how to keep traffic and parking as safe and efficient as possible around our school:

Ambassador Drive Kiss n' Drop

In the mornings there is only one Kiss n' Drop lane active. To use the Kiss n' Drop, please stay in the right-hand lane, leaving the left lane free for Kindy and Pre-Primary parents to access the parking bays.

In the afternoons, the Kiss n' Drop operates in two lanes, with traffic then merging to a single lane. If you are in the left lane, please give way to Kindy and Pre-Primary parents backing out of the parking spaces.

Often, vehicles waiting to enter the Kiss n' Drop can cause traffic to come to a standstill at the roundabout at Ambassador Drive and Paddington Avenue, causing unnecessary, and sometimes dangerous, congestion. This is inconvenient for residents and there have been reports of dangerous driving to overtake stationary vehicles.

If you cannot turn into the car park because it is full, please continue through the roundabout and circle back a few minutes later. Please do not stop and block traffic from entering the roundabout. If there is traffic stopped at the roundabout, please do not overtake.

Moore Drive Kiss n' Drop

The bus bay on Moore Drive adjacent to the school is now a Kiss n' Drop facility in the mornings and afternoons. Whilst this has greatly assisted traffic flow around the school, it is essential that we abide by the rules below to avoid causing unnecessary congestion and to maintain the support of the City of Joondalup with this arrangement:

- 1. Parents must stay in their car.
- 2. Parents should park at the eastern-most point of the bay, so that other cars can move into the Kiss n' Drop behind them.
- 3. While waiting, if you can move your vehicle further up the bay, please do so. This will allow vehicles behind to move up and others can move into the bay.
- 4. If you have been at the Kiss n' Drop for a few minutes and your child has not arrived, please exit the bay, complete a u-turn at the Christchurch Avenue exit, drive down Moore Drive to the Connolly Drive roundabout and return to the Kiss n' Drop. This allows parents waiting to enter the bay and pick up their children if they are already waiting. Take extra care around the pedestrian crossing.

These arrangements (particularly point no.4) allow children to be picked up in a timely manner and for the flow of traffic to continue unimpeded, which is essential to maintain the City of Joondalup's support.

Please also refer to the recent Connect Notice sent to all families regarding traffic and parking, with maps attached.

Protective behaviours are a set of skills that form part of the WA Health curriculum and aim to support children to recognise when they feel unsafe and to take appropriate action to feel safe.

TA37 Class Article

Food and Fibre in TA37

In Year Five, students learn how food is produced in factories and explore the impact this has on the food's nutritional value, cost, environmental impact and of course taste.

During these lessons students have compared a variety of peas. The class favourite was the fresh snow peas while the tinned peas were agreed by all to be DISGUSTING!

When making pancakes we compared pre-cooked pancakes to the shake-and-make mix and a homemade batch. The pre-cooked was a favourite, not surprising considering there was 12g of sugar in them!!

We learnt that in some 'Australian-grown' orange juices only 9% of the ingredients come from Australia.

It was nice to hear that the favourite juice was the organic juice which had the lowest carbon footprint and provided one serve of fruit.

Our final project will be to plan and make a pizza and create a report on its nutritional value, cost, environmental impact and of course taste.

Sat 11th Nov 2pm thru to Sun 12th Nov Noon


